SUMMER VACATION CAMP. SEPTEMBER, 1931.

Instructions & Regulations.

1. The Camp will be held at Gore Farm, Ashmore, Nr. Salisbury.
2. Flying will commence on Tuesday, 1st September, and end not later than Saturday 26th September. Members of the Imperial College Gliding Club only may attend the Camp unless otherwise determined by the Committee. *Wed 28th*
3. (1) A Member wishing to attend Camp must send the following remittance, which will be used for the purpose of providing food:-
 - (a) If he is staying less than one week, the total amount reckoned at 3/- per day.
 - (b) If he is staying one week or more, a minimum of 20/- which will cover the first week. Subsequent weekly contributions of 20/- must be paid at least 3 days before the beginning of the respective week. Extra days will be charged at 3/- per day.
- (2) In the above, "one week" means only seven consecutive days. A part of a day shall count as a whole day.
- (3) The above remittance must be posted not later than 31st August to:- The CAPTAIN, IMPERIAL COLLEGE GLIDING CLUB, GORE FARM, ASHMORE, Nr. SALISBURY.
- (4) Remittances should be made by Postal Order, payable to the Hon. Jun. Treasurer, Imperial College Gliding Club, and should be left uncrossed. *[Signature]*

- (5) Once the Camp has commenced, no money will be returned under any circumstances. If the Camp should be officially broken up, any money in hand will go to the Club Funds.
4. Formal notice must be given that a Member wishes to attend the Camp. Exact dates he wishes to enter and leave the Camp should be stated. Notice should be sent as detailed in 3 (3) above, and should be accompanied by the appropriate remittance. Members arriving without proper notice having been given will be expected to provide their own food for at least 3 days.
5. He should also report on the day previous to his leaving the Camp. If a Member leaves the Camp before the time he has stated, or without giving due notice, he will be required by the Captain to furnish an explanation. Should this not be considered adequate the offence will be treated as a breach of Camp discipline, and the Member may be debarred from attending subsequent Camps held by the Club. Should the gliders be so badly damaged that it cannot be repaired before the end of the Camp, then the Camp may be officially broken up.
6. Members are reminded that Gliding is a sport requiring extreme fitness of mind and body. Previous to and during the Camp

possible should be obtained.

- 7. No intentional damage must be done to any property in or around the Farm, to the Farm lands, or to any adjoining property.
- 8. The Flying Regulations must be obeyed at all times. (Attention is drawn to Rule 10).
- 9. The authority of the Captain will be absolute.
- 10. By entering the Camp, a Member shall automatically signify his acceptance of these "Instructions & Regulations".
