Dear Sir,

The Club's Annual Summer Camp will be held during the month of September, at Gore Farm, Ashmore, Nr. Salisbury.

Gore Farm is situated at an altitude of 750 ft. on Fontmell Down, in North Dorset. It is about two miles by road from the village of Fontmell Magna, which is four miles due south of Salisbury. The nearest railway station, "Semley, for Shaftesbury", is on the Southern Railway main line between Salisbury and Yeovil. There is a 'bus service from the station as far as the village.

As regards sleeping accommodation at the Farm, a large dormitory is available, and palliases will be provided for 20 persons, but Members must bring their own blankets (at least 3), one large mug, knife, fork, desert spoon and teaspoon, and sleeping bag. All meals will be provided at the Farm at a cost of 20/- per person per week, payable in advance. Each Member must bring slippers and pyjamas. Full details are given in the enclosed "Instructions & Regulations".

As regards clothing, for hot weather, tennis shirts and "shorts" will be most comfortable. It will be advisable to take also trousers or plus-fours, as the weather may be chilly. In case of wet weather, waterproof clothing is essential. Puttees and stout boots would be advisable, as the long grass is sure to be damp in the mornings. Members are advised to bring a change of underclothing as it will probably be difficult to get clothes washed.

The programme of each day's activities will be arranged by the Captain, and will include the preparation of weather charts, construction and repair work, and flying. Members will also help with the Farm work, cooking and harvesting.
